~~Just as~~ It would be an act of sheer folly for the lungs or the stomach to desire to be the heart - if they could speak; ~~or~~ vice versa or for the heart to desire to be the wings or the stomach, if they could speak. Each organ serves its ~~as~~ predestined role elected by the Creator. For the heart to perform the role of the lungs or stomach ~~is~~ that ~~as~~ is obviously a physical impossibility.

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It is not the individual
Olfans who have elected their
role, but the Creator of the
cosmos who has made the
choice. So too the roles
of the Jew, Jewess, Levi,
~~and~~ Cohen, on one hand, and
the non-Jew man or woman
on the other hand is a
matter of Divine election.

It is not the Jew who
made the choice. ~~the Jews role~~
is his destiny, not his
choice. Thus the concept
of a "chosen people" used
as a tool by anti-Semites
to harass Jews, reveals

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only their own ignorance and
insensitivity.

are in consonance with
our spiritual and mystical
personalities - to ensure that
we thereby merit eternity.
As Jews, we further
resolve to achieve

Communion with the
Unity of the Creator in
accordance with our
mystical-spiritual
makeup. "Yisrael, Devarim
Vehahodotuk Boruchet Chad
Hu" - "Israel, the Torah
and the Holy One Blessed
be He are One." That
is a goal that can be
achieved by the Jew
only when every decision
of ^{his} private life, or
decision of the community
or nation of Israel is
formed on the basis of

Torah as interpreted by the Torah Sages.
